

UI/UX CAREER ROADMAP CHECKLIST

1. Understand the Fundamentals

- Learn what UX vs UI actually means
- Understand user-centered design principles
- Learn basic usability concepts (heuristics, accessibility, hierarchy)
- Study common UX processes (research → wireframes → testing → iteration)
- Analyze real products (apps/websites) from a UX perspective

2. Learn Core Tools (Don't Overdo It)

- Choose 1–2 design tools (Figma, Adobe XD, Sketch)
- Learn wireframing and prototyping basics
- Understand components, auto layout, and design systems
- Practice recreating existing interfaces
- Learn basic collaboration workflows (handoff, feedback)

3. Start Practicing with Real Projects

- Redesign an existing app or website
- Create at least 2–3 personal UX projects
- Solve real problems (not just aesthetic redesigns)
- Define goals, users, and constraints for each project
- Document your thinking—not just the final design

4. Learn UX Research & Strategy

- Practice writing problem statements
- Create user personas (simple and realistic)
- Conduct basic user research (surveys, interviews, or assumptions if needed)
- Map user flows and journeys
- Understand how to validate design decisions

5. Build a Strong Portfolio

- Create 2–4 solid case studies (quality over quantity)
- Clearly explain your process (not just visuals)
- Show problem → solution → impact
- Keep layout clean, simple, and easy to scan
- Optimize for both desktop and mobile viewing

6. Develop Visual & Interaction Skills

- Improve typography, spacing, and layout
- Understand color usage and accessibility
- Learn basic UI patterns and conventions
- Design consistent components and systems
- Explore micro-interactions and usability details

7. Get Real-World Experience

- Take on freelance or small client projects
- Volunteer or redesign real-world problems
- Collaborate with developers or other designers
- Work within constraints (deadlines, feedback, revisions)
- Practice presenting and explaining your work

8. Build Your Personal Brand

- Create a simple portfolio website
- Optimize your LinkedIn profile
- Share your work or insights (optional but powerful)
- Write about your process or lessons learned
- Start building a network in the design community

9. Prepare for Job Applications

- Practice explaining your case studies out loud
- Prepare for common UX interview questions
- Refine your resume and portfolio presentation
- Apply consistently (don't wait for perfection)
- Track applications and follow up

10. Keep Growing After You Start

- Ask for feedback regularly
- Continue learning new tools and methods
- Stay updated on UX trends and best practices
- Reflect on your work and improve your process
- Build deeper expertise in a specific area (optional)
